Your Money or Your Life?

There are times when it can feel as if everyone is asking for money – all for good causes: Children in Need, CAFOD Family Fast Day, The Poppy Appeal, second collections at church, CIDIC.... The list goes on and on. Social scientists often term the result of this as compassion fatigue. In our reading from the first book of the Kings, the widow gives everything she has to Elijah – the last dregs of food that might keep her and her son alive for their last day. Despite her generosity neither her handful of meal nor her little bit of oil are used up – she is rewarded by the Lord for her generosity there and then.

When Jesus observes the widow dropping her last couple of coins into the collection box he commends her to the disciples because "from the little she had has put in ..., all she had to live on." Her reward is not likely to be in this world.

Four weeks ago in the Gospel, Jesus told the devout young man to "Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." Note, he is told to rid himself of his earthly wealth before following Jesus.

So what are we to do?

Are we all called to give up everything for the Kingdom? I don't have an answer for me, so I'll need to go back to prayer for guidance.

One last thought. When approached by someone on the street asking for "money for food" and there's a doubt as to what they want the money for: remember, what they do with the cash is on their conscience; whether you give or not is on yours!
