Assisted Suicide Bill. The second reading of this bill will go before parliament on 29th November. This Bill will legalise doctor-assisted suicide for those who are terminally ill. The definition of 'terminally ill' has yet to be defined fully. It will legalise doctor involvement in causing the death of their patients. Evidence from other countries shows the application of the law broadens with time. Should society expect the NHS to offer this 'service.' It is important to write to your MP now asking them to vote against the Bill.
