Thought for the Week 3rd Sunday of Lent 12th March 2023

The story of the Samaritan woman at the well with Jesus has so many lessons for us. It gives us clues to several of Jesus' most profound truths- love they neighbour being the obvious one.

Historically, in Jesus time, the Samaritans were a race with whom the Jews did not associate. But Jesus ignored that fact—she was his neighbour, another human being created by God. Isn't this how we should look at migrants, outcasts and people who may hurt us? Jesus loves ALL people and he wants us to try to emulate Him.

The woman asked Jesus some pointed questions and she must have found His answers astonishing. He told her He was the Messiah and had come to offer Living Water as a salvation.

"If you knew... who it is that asks for a drink.. He would have given you living water."

He has done just this for her. Jesus offers us salvation in the form of Living Waters from God.

At the end of the story, as the Apostles return, she runs off to spread the news she has to her people- something Jesus wants us to do throughout the world. Extraordinarily, her fellow Samaritans believed her, despite viewing Jews as enemies. Many fellow Jews of the time did not- or took much longer to convince.

The woman at the well gives us a tale of Love, Truth, Redemption and Acceptance. Let us try to copy these qualities and put Jesus example in the forefront of our daily lives – no matter how difficult.

Jesus wants us ALL in his holy kingdom, not just a few.
