## Thought for the Week

The Baptism of the Lord Shine Jesus Shine!

Isaiah in this weekend's first reading speaks of the "glory of the Lord" being revealed and he calls to Jerusalem and Sion to be a "herald of good news". Through our baptism, we too are called to be heralds of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

In the media and sometimes in our own conversations and thoughts we hear the bad news that our country, our towns and our own parish area are becoming: less Christian, less interested in faith and religion, and people don't want to come to church.

There is hope and some good news! We are just moving out of the Christmas season when, since the end of November, my neighbours and yours have been decorating the outsides of their houses with more sparkly lights and decorations than ever. In our downbeat moments we complain about the commercialisation of Christmas and the loss of its "real meaning" but hope lives. Those lights in your street and mine show that the fact of Christmas is still known, even if someone puts lights up "because everyone else has"; the reason they were shining out was because humankind's Saviour was born in a stable 2,000 years ago.

Those lights shone out because of that Good News. The psalmist speaks of the Lord as "wrapped in light as in a robe!" Our job is to keep the light of that message alive, to share it and spread it.

Whatever new year resolutions you have (or haven't) made Isaiah gives us some ideas of ways we can make a difference in the coming year and let Christ's light into others' lives:

"comfort my people, says your God"
"prepare the way of the Lord"
be a "herald of good news"

How we are called to do these things will be different for each one of us but whatever we do may there be even more lights shining out for Jesus next Christmas!
