Thought for the week 24th Sunday of the Year (B) 15th September, 2024

For a journalist the most important of the key 6 investigative questions "What? Who? Where? How? Why? When?" is "Who?" Whether looking at a press release or interviewing someone, it is important to know the source of any statements and who could gain from making them.

The media and popular music is full of reference to "Who?" For example, the band "The Who" and their hit song "Who are You?" The popularity of book and TV Whodunnits? and of documentary programmes like "Who do you think you are?" attest to our inquisitiveness about "Who?"

In today's Gospel the most important of all "Who?" Questions relates to the identity of Jesus. Jesus was aware from his disciples that many among the Jewish people at that time thought that He was John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah or another prophet. Others saw him as a leader who would help save Israel from Roman rule.

However, when asked by Jesus " *Who do you say that I am*?" Peter replied, "*You are the Christ.*" Peter knew He was the Messiah, the Son of the living God. This "Who?" Question is as relevant to us today as it was to the people in Jesus' time.

Who is the Living God to each one of us individually? As a child we may have had an image of a bearded figure on a throne sitting in judgement. Maybe now rather than visualizing in our mind's eye, we feel God's presence or "hear" it more clearly by listening with our heart as well as our ears.

Prayerful listening needs frequent practice. We need to discern carefully who we are listening to. Is it the voice of the Holy Spirit which can be soft as a Summer breeze, or are we just hearing the superficial sounds of our worldly wants and desires?

Taking time to appreciate the beauty of the God-created natural world can bring us closer to God. We can do this by being directly in nature or by being transported there by skilled writers, such as the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins. Verse 1 of his poem "As Kingfishers Catch Fire, Dragonflies Draw Flame", blazes with colourful, tuneful descriptions of the natural world. Verse 2 helps us understand the mystery of "Who?" In our loving relationship with God.

I say more: the just man justices; Keeps grace; that keeps all his goings graces Acts in God's eye what in God's eye he is – Christ. For Christ plays in ten thousand places. Lovely in limbs, and lovely in eyes not his To the Father through the features of men's faces.
