Thought for the week 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time 16th January 2022

The theme of this week's readings is Weddings and gifts. During the wedding feast at Cana, Jesus responds to his mother's request to help even as He reminds her that His hour is not yet come. I love the fact that Mary ignores Jesus' response and acts as any mother would by assuming her son will help her! She simply tells the servers, "Do what He tells you."

His miracle is lavish as it produces an over-abundance of wine. This serves to remind us that this is the abundance waiting for us in God's kingdom if we are true to His word.

We are reminded that God has given us all gifts, but they are very different and varied and we must try and discern which ones we own. The gifts are given to us freely for a purpose which we may never understand or even know until after we die.

Cardinal Newman states:

"God has created me to do Him some DEFINITE service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to any other."

This means if we do not fulfil it then the work never gets done—an opportunity will be missed to evangelise for Jesus.

We must try and participate in Christ's mission and use our unique talents for good. Today's gospel also emphasises the unique role which Our Lady can play in interceding for us with her son. We must take her advice and "Do whatever He tells you."

Perhaps we could decide to come to one of the Synodal Pathway meetings which Deacon Brian is organizing to help compose our response to the Holy Father's request for input as to the future directions for our church.
