I started my Christmas shopping in a bookshop, looking for a Christmas book for my new nephew. The tables were groaning with beautiful children's books, lovely newly printed pages, beautiful illustrations and covers embossed with silver and gold banners. There were books about reindeer, and about snowmen, books about elves and about mice and fairies, but I couldn't see a book about the Nativity.

When I asked the smiley manager if there were any, she looked blank. Then suddenly she blinked as if she understood. But she seemed a bit embarrassed. "We don't have any here," she said, "but I think we may have one in another part of the shop." She took me right to the back of the shop and after some scrabbling about in a very bottom dusty and unloved shelf, she pulled out a small board book. It had awful block colour digital pictures of a featureless Mary and Joseph standing stiffly behind a blanketed lump in a box of straw.

I thanked her but thought I'd have a look in the same shelf myself. Among the books about myths and legends, I came across a really beautiful book by Brian Wildsmith about Jesus's birth which was exactly what I had hoped for.

But I left the bookshop feeling a bit wistful. What I had experienced was such a clichéd modern parable about the true meaning of Christmas. Then I thought about the real baby, born in a cave, in a forgotten far-flung part of an occupied territory; a baby born of humble but courageous parents.
