THE CHRISTMAS FLOWER ARRANGING WORKSHOP IS NOW FULL

Thought for the week 33rd Sunday of the Year (B) 17th November, 2024

While writing this, sitting close to the banks of Loch Lomond – only a short walk from St Kessog's Catholic Church in the village of Balloch – I'm aware that St Kessog or MacKessog is not a saint I recall from my childhood in Scotland. St Patrick, St Columba and St Mungo were the ones we heard most about at school.

According to some sources, St Kessog was born into the Royal family of Munster in Ireland, son of King Cashel and educated by St Patrick for missionary work in Scotland. Others say that he was of Roman army descent. He was known as the soldier-saint or 'priest-soldier' as he went about with a sword tied to his waist. He was widely venerated in medieval times. Troops under Robert Bruce used "Blessed Kessog" as a battle cry in the wars of independence.

It was to the village of Luss on the west banks of Loch Lomond that St Kessog's mission began in the early 6th century. He established a monastery on the island of Inchtavannach (Monk's Island) on the western side of Loch Lomond. Near the top of Luss Glen there is a memorial stone and a cell on the right side of the wood.

We visited Luss on a weekday before the coach-loads of tourists arrived and it was beautifully tranquil as the mist rose over the loch with Ben Lomond towering above. How much more tranquil it must have been back in St Kessog's time before the motor boat and motor car. We enjoyed gazing at the yellow, red, and golden browns of the shoreline beech tree leaves against the white-grey trunks, in this beautiful, spiritual, peaceful, place. Later that evening as we saw the stunning beauty of the northern lights, it struck me how vital for these early Celtic Christians was this appreciation of nature, the seasons, the shifting tides, the ever-changing skies.

We pray on these shores, where the Holy Spirit was so alive in the early Christian missionaries, that our connection with nature will deepen our closeness to God the creator. In words of the ancient celtic blessing:

May the road rise up to meet you.
May the wind be always at your back.
May the sun shine warm upon your face;
the rains fall soft upon your fields and until we meet again,
may God hold you in the palm of His hand.
