# Thought for the Week

Last week's Mass in celebration of Fr Michael's eight years tending us was a joyous occasion. Many shared fond memories of Father Michael's time with us over tea and cake.

During the Mass we all enjoyed hearing the choir sing the beautiful words Fr Michael wrote to the tune of Suo Gan, which translates from the Welsh as lullaby. One word especially caught my attention: 'pilgrims'

Pilgrimage holds profound significance for Christians, symbolizing a journey towards a deeper faith and divine encounter. Jesuit priest Father Gerard W. Hughes exemplified this through his writings and personal journeys. In his book 'In Search of a Way', he recounts his pilgrimage on foot to Rome and reflects on the spiritual insights he obtained on his journey.

Pope Francis has given the 2025 Jubilee Year the theme 'Pilgrims of Hope', inviting us to undertake a pilgrimage.

He encouraged the faithful world wide to embark on pilgrimages in this sacred year of spiritual renewal, reflection and grace.

One of the most renowned Christian pilgrimages is the Way of St James leading to Santiago de Compostela in Spain. The numbers walking a section of the Camino has been steadily increasing with nearly half a million making a section of this pilgrimage route in 2024. I numbered among them in September 2022 and found it a wonderful spiritual experience.

As Christians we have been taught to view life as a pilgrimage, a journey toward spiritual fulfilment. We were fortunate to have Fr Michael shepherd us on our spiritual journey for so many years. We thank him in his words, sang after our Communion, for his strength to serve and love us all with,

'Bread of heaven, Bread of pilgrims.'
