August is the month many families get away for a holiday, re-fresh, recharge and get a fresh perspective before the big return to work, school, college and University.

And in this pandemic year, unlike any other, most have been keen to sieze the opportunity of a return to this pleasant ritual.

For our family, it has been an unusual August. We found ourselves gathered in Cheshire last weekend for the funeral service of a dear brother-in law, Malcolm. We knew Malcolm had cycled from Land's End to John O' Groats twice, first at the age of 60 and then at 70, raising thousands of pounds for charity. But in tributes from Malcolm's wife, son and daughter we learned much more about the good he did, quietly and modestly. Though numbers were restricted, most close family were gathered to share our mixed feelings of loss and celebration.

Malcolm stayed very much in our minds as we journeyed up the next day to the shores of Loch Long not far from the submarine base at Faslane, where our son Jack is currently undergoing training as a marine engineer. Deployment dates are uncertain as everything is on a 'need to know' basis, but within the next few weeks he is due to have his first 3-6 month deployment on a submarine.

The 10 mile hike we did, afforded us bird's eye views down to Loch Long and of the Loch Gareloch, including the submarine base. As we looked over at the mountain known as the Cobbler or Ben Arthur, 884 metres high, that figure resonated as I realised it was the depth that modern submarines can dive to.

Perhaps it's helped by a reconnection with my childhood, but walking in the mountains of Scotland brings me fresh perspective, hope and inspiration. And more so during this year of limits, curfews restrictions. Let all of us who've been lucky to enjoy the freedom of new landscapes, fresh horizons to celebrate with those we love, give thanks to the Lord, reminding ourselves
