Thought for the Week 5th Sunday of Lent 26th March 2023

On this last Sunday in Lent, before Palm Sunday and Holy Week, we get a foretaste of the resurrection message of Easter Sunday. The clear promise of God is that resurrection is not just for his Son but for humankind too.

The great Psalm 129, the De Profundis, seems to start off with despair and anguish for the human condition: "I cry to you from the depths", "If you would mark our guilt, who would survive". The response offers us hope for, if we rely upon the Lord, with him "there is mercy and fullness of redemption."

Redemption and resurrection can be understood in many ways: a physical return from the dead, like Lazarus in the Gospel, or something more mystical and unknowable at the end of time.

The readings from Ezekiel and St Paul, in his letter to the Romans, promise something just as amazing: a rebirth and a re-giving of life in the here and now. We can be refreshed, renewed and transformed through God's gift of his Spirit today and every day. As St Paul says, the Spirit of God makes its home in those who turn to the spiritual rather than those always focusing on unspiritual things. If we try to live our lives in the Spirit then God will live in us.

The promise of the resurrection that we so joyfully celebrate at Easter is with us already. With Holy Week in sight, it is not too late to re-energise the spiritual side of ourselves so that we can even more fully share and be part of the fulfilment of God's promise and his plan for each one of us.
