THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK PALM SUNDAY **2ND APRIL, 2023**

As we celebrate Palm Sunday and come towards the end of our Lenten Journey we think of Our Lord arriving in Jerusalem to a wonderful reception, but we also prepare for contemplation of his suffering.

Each Lenten journey to this point will be different.

For much of our Lenten journey this year, we were travelling in Andalucia, Spain. Though we would not be there for Semana Santa (Holy Week), we were present for some of the preparations for the passionate and spectacular celebrations that would follow.

Outside Malaga Cathedral we attended a dusk Procession of young and old parishioners carrying flickering 5-foot tall candles, pausing periodically for a prayer or hymn. In Granada we watched as 20 men walked with tiny steps under the heavily weighted platform that they would use in Holy Week to carry ancient wooden sculptures of Our Lord or the Virgin Mary. Their training, effort and dedication was inspirational.

During Lent a withdrawal to nature can also allow space for prayerful contemplation. In Spain, we found this during a trip to the Alpujarras Hills. High above a gorge we heard the distant clanging of the bells worn by the goats in the valley below and saw above in the distance, the snow-capped peaks of the Sierra Nevada. Such perspective is a prompt to prayer, a time to reflect on how we've listened and what we've learned.

In the words of Isaiah:

The Lord has opened my ear For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away

There are many Lenten pathways and the way we celebrate Easter will differ among Christian communities across the world. There is a place for both the loud, vibrant and spectacular, and also for quieter, simpler, more reflective celebrations.

As we prepare for Easter, we are reminded in the Gospel of how our Lord was to travel on Palm Sunday

"He is humble, he rides on a donkey."

Lord may the blessed palm leaves we receive guide us on our final steps towards the end of our Lenten Journey.
