Thought for the Week Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 3rd September 2023

Last weekend over a hundred thousand young people gathered in Reading for the music festival. It's something of a rite of passage for many teenagers, and was for our own.

For many it comes after weeks of exam revision and is part of a Summer celebration of good results achieved; for others it is a brief escape from disappointment. When this sinks in fully there may be disillusionment and a big loss of confidence.

The move from school or college to a university or to a job is a challenge we can all relate to. At that age, most of us still have a lot of growing up to do, while tasked with learning new 'real world' skills and responsibilities. To maintain self-belief and confidence is for many a big hurdle. Even after becoming highly qualified for a role, we may feel what is known as 'imposter syndrome' – not quite believing in ourselves in our appointed role. Faith is replaced by doubt then fear.

Last week father Michael spoke about St Peter and the occasions his faith faltered and he was gripped by fear. For example, when Jesus called on to him to walk across the water during the storm. He began with faith and courage but then doubts crept in, leading to fear, and he began to sink.

"Take courage. It is I; do not be afraid." (Matthew 14:27)

With the Lord's encouragement he regained his faith and reached safety. The other well known occasion that St Peter lost faith and was overcome by fear was after Jesus' arrest when he denied three times that he even knew Him. Yet Jesus forgave these lapses, helped him strengthen his faith and he became 'the Rock' the Church was built on.

As many thousands of young people move on this autumn from school to college or to jobs, let us pray for them, asking that their self-confidence is nourished by their tutors, employers, work colleagues and they are supported spiritually and practically by their friends, families, churches and local communities.
