Thought for the week Feast of the Epiphany 5th January, 2025

I would love to know how the wise men reacted, and the discussions they had, when they first caught site of 'The Star.' Was their decision to follow it instantaneous, or did they reflect on its significance for a prolonged period? Whatever happened, they set out on a pilgrimage of faith to seek the newborn king of the Jews, despite the obstacles and risks they might encounter. Once they found Jesus, they had no need of the star since he is The Light of the World. In this encounter God showed that Jesus had come to reconcile not only the Jews with his Father, but the whole world.

As individuals, and as a parish community, it is not a star we are invited to follow, but the Light of the World. As we begin this New Year, we as a parish community find ourselves somewhat unexpectedly on a pilgrimage of faith.
