He is risen!

The fundamental core of our profession of faith is that Christ has truly risen from the dead.

When the two Marys arrived at the tomb, they were completely unprepared for what they found. The American pastor, Eugene Peterson writes,

"The Christian life begins here: a community ..... gathered at the place of impossibility, the tomb."

This community of Jesus's friends and followers went on a rollercoaster of a ride from the triumphal entry into Jerusalem, through His betrayal by Judas and to His death on the cross. Then we have the glory of the resurrection! I sometimes wonder what it would have been like to go through all that with the apostles. How did Peter feel - from promising to die for Christ to denying Him outside the high priest's palace, to entering the tomb and finding the linen cloths lying on the ground? The wonder of his finally understanding,

" the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead."

As our Lenten journey has now finished, with perhaps varying degrees of success, we too can wonder at the glory of the resurrection. For all the times we may have come up short, this miracle means we can never be deprived of the love of Christ who conquered death for all of us.
