Thought for the week Baptism of the Lord 9th January 2022

'God's grace [...] has made salvation possible for the whole human race.'

It can be quite hard for us to reconcile the facts that when Our Lord walked this earth, He was both completely man and completely God. The many miracles He worked proved His supreme Godhead, something we also see in today's psalm, a paean to the Almighty – 'Lord God, how great you are'.

And yet, the very real sufferings Jesus endured proved His humanity with all its frailties - not just during His Passion; remember also His very human reaction to the death of His friend Lazarus, giving us the shortest verse in the Bible: 'Jesus wept.' (Jn 11:35).

His Baptism by John in the River Jordan was one of those occasions when Our Lord behaved in His 'human' state if I can describe it like that. Clearly there was no need for the Son of God to be baptised! It is in the Gospel of St Matthew we read that the Baptist felt unworthy to carry out this action saying instead that, 'I need to be baptised by you, and do you come to me?'. It's almost as if Our Lord was leading by example, while also receiving the powerful and loving endorsement of His Father and the strength of the Holy Spirit.

The message is clear: the teachings of the Son of God have the seal of authority from the Father. They are the means of our salvation and the vivifying water of baptism cleanses our soul to make it more receptive to those teachings. The stain of original sin is removed and we have the opportunity to start afresh. Although we stumble and fall repeatedly, we have endless chances to start again via the Sacrament of Reconciliation – such is God's love for us. It is consoling to know that salvation is possible for us all and that what we have to do 'is to give up everything that does not lead to God' (Titus 2:11).

Perhaps it is time for those New Year resolutions to focus on the health of our soul...
