## PARISH NEWSLETTER - 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time - 20 July 2025

#### What was raised at our Parish Synodal Assembly?

Each table was asked to reflect on three questions: What are we doing well - that we can build on? What are we not doing so well - that we could improve on? What are we not doing - that we could be doing?

Below you will find the core issues that each table identified. Please reflect on these, discuss them with one another, and above all consider areas where you could be involved and make a difference.

Table 1: 1. Singing, prayer, Children's Mass, WhatsApp and welcoming people

- 2. We could welcome newcomers better. We could listen more to newcomers. Get to know different people at different Mass times.
- 3. More general information should be shared at Mass so that we are all informed about what is happening. The types of prayer being used should be explained to everyone. There should be more effort to look after the elderly and single parents, the sick and so on. These vulnerable individuals require additional care and support.
- **Table 2:** 1. Liturgy, streaming, and welcoming people within our circles great job, Deacon Brian! 2. We could improve coordination between groups. We could give better training for different roles. We could welcome newcomers better. Need new volunteers.
- 3. We should reach out to non-Catholic groups.
- **Table 3**: 1. Friendly, welcoming, strong congregation, great music, an engaging priest, and a multicultural community.
- 2. Teenagers could attend more often, and there could be more training for new altar servers.
- 3. The sense of community can be diluted, and we should encourage increased attendance and follow-up after vibrant services. For example, the International Mass is a significant opportunity.
- Table 4: 1. Sense of community, activities, and outreach. E.g., food banks and homeless charities.
- 2. Engage more with Youth, sermons could be Youth-focused, there could be a side room to engage with Children, we could pray for the side room, we could pray for the sick more. We could welcome people better.
- 3. We should try new things.
- **Table 5:** 1. Active Parish with strong community spirit.
- 2. We could follow up after the big services better and evangelise more.
- 3. We should be building a vibrant community, using Youth to encourage people to attend.
- Table 6: 1. Friendly, welcoming, and excellent newsletter. Volunteers are excellent—close family, helping others, and Children and Youth Mass.
- 2. See more children's engagement, more parish activities and social events, more spiritual activities, and interact with the deanery more often.
- 3. Youth and Children need to be engaged more; we could even reach out to local groups, such as the Scouts, and connect with the community, including other Catholic Schools in Reading.

The PPC will also reflect on these issues and seek to identify several key ones that can be considered in more depth at the next Assembly. In the meantime please ponder them and discuss them and, as I said above, please consider how you could be involved. Fr Colin
