Stop me if you've heard this one: a man drives into town for an important appointment and he's late. The town is packed and he can't find anywhere to park. "Please Lord," he prays, "Help me to find a parking space. If you do, I promise I'll go to Mass every day for a month." Just then, a parking space becomes free at the side of the road. "Oh - don't worry, Lord," says the happy chap; "I've found a space now."

Last Sunday, Fr Michael reminded us of the importance of remembering to express our gratitude, as we considered the story of the one leper who thanked Our Lord when ten were healed. I am sure the other nine were also thrilled - but they just didn't think. They took the miracle for granted. And maybe we are the same sometimes. We are not being intentionally ungrateful, but we can be guilty of taking things for granted and - also for not recognising the ways in which our prayers are answered. The little story above illustrates that pretty perfectly!

After last week's lesson in gratitude, from this weekend's readings I take the lesson of perseverance (especially in prayer), support and shared strength. In the first reading, even Moses couldn't win without the help and support of others. Perhaps this is a lesson we could take to heart in our parish? We can sometimes be reluctant to step forward, to offer to share our gifts and talents, to contribute our ideas and thoughts - and expect our parish to continue to function without much help from us. Everyone has something to contribute, even if it's only to listen and nod in agreement - or not!

Maybe this Sunday the Synodal Meeting - the Gathering Together of our very fine community at St Michael's - is the start of a new surge in support and growth - for both our parish and you and me. *Onwards and Upwards*!
