Today's readings could be called apocalyptic, with descriptions of the earth being shaken by earthquakes and scorched by fire. In the past weeks our news media has been full of reports of Hurricane Melissa hitting Jamaica, several using the words: "apocalyptic scenes" to describe the devastation. Our modern popular understanding of the word apocalypse is of death and destruction. Yet the word derives from the Greek meaning to "uncover to reveal'. So, the readings may be interpreted as a way of enlightening us to endings, to new beginnings and to impart hope.

The wildfires, hurricanes and floods of recent year are revealing to us that we are not looking after the Earth God created for us. This is backed up with conclusive scientific research. Pope Francis and now Pope Leo have urged us to put pressure on our leaders to take steps to avert the global warming-related disasters caused by our use of fossil fuels and consumerist lifestyles.

As individuals, families and communities we are all trying to make better choices; for example, to reduce plastic use and to recycle more. In our parish effective initiatives have been encouraged by the Thoughtful living Group, including the recycling bins.

At the individual level too we all face losses—the devasting loss of a loved one, the loss of a of a job—and often we need to face new beginnings. It is how well we support and build up each other individually, in our community, and in our world that will determine how well we cope with the losses, challenges, death and destructive forces that we all at some time have to face.

At the conclusion of the Prayer by St Francis of Assiss, we are lifted by the ultimate hope that at the end of all our strivings in this world

... it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.
