'Vanity of vanities . . . all is vanity' the Preacher tells us in the first reading. 'You fool', Jesus has God saying as he tells his parable of the rich man in the Gospel. Confronting words about the way we see life, the way we arrange our priorities.

We live in a time and a culture and a society that stores up some strange treasures for itself: the world of advertising tells us to buy very nice clothes and very nice shoes that strangely seem to have no ability to make people happy; and so many have no concern where they came from: whether they came from sweatshops or places with just working conditions. The prosperous nations of the world have an increasing proportion of people who want to make their treasure a nation which excludes people of other ethnic origin, culture or tongue; and sadly, even many Christians think that such an attitude is compatible with making themselves rich in the sight of God.

'Vanity of vanities'. So much is vanity. Because the treasure we'll take with us is simply the person we're making ourselves to be. And so, today's Gospel is asking us just how rich we are in that regard. Perhaps the question then is how do we tally up the value of that treasure, how do we make a stock-take of these riches in our own life?

I think if we go through the Gospel we could sum up the things that make us truly rich under these headings:

* firstly, a spirit of service - that our lives are about self-giving; that we're filled up inwardly in so far as we give away something of ourselves generously.

and then a passion, an enthusiasm, a fire in the belly, to build the kingdom of God; that our faith is not something peripheral to our lives, but something that gives us a passion about how we live, about what effect we have in our little part of the world, and our little part of time.

that we're a person of prayer: that our seeking for, our touching of God, is what gives life to our heart, and heart to all that we do.

- * that our life is about relations: that faith is leading us to open up our lives, our hearts to others, that we find God IN others, that we serve God IN others, that values like justice and compassion dominate everything about how we think and about how we act.
- * and finally love that love overrides every other consideration: law, and self-righteousness, and the need to be right, and the need to get even; that love for human beings, of every shape, colour, size, nationality, language, is the absolutely typifying mark of who we are.

Perhaps this can be a thumbnail sketch of what can make us truly rich, of what true treasure is made of, the treasure which today's Gospel says makes us rich in the sight of God.
