We have been reminded again and again that Advent is the time to get ourselves ready for the Lord who loves us. Bit by bit I prepare myself for the manger, for the incredible event of our Lord's incarnation. The divine made human. I prepare to see the glory of the Lord bursting forth from a humble stable, in an ordinary town, and He a tiny baby.

But as always, as Christmas draws near, my human-ness means I'm caught up with thinking all about how *I'm* going to be ready, what *I* need to do. With all that focus on myself and my preparations, I can easily forget that it is God and not us doing all the heavy lifting. God loves us and he comes to us even when we are too busy to see Him drawing near. We would see Him, running towards us with open arms to embrace us just as we are, if we only looked up from our day-to-day preoccupations.

The readings this Sunday, remind us of this dynamic Lord, hurrying to meet us. At this time of year when our flowerbeds and fields are mainly wet mud and soggy, dead leaves, it's hard to imagine flowers and vegetables pushing up green shoots through the dark earth, but like the farmer we must believe the active energy of God will revive the soil of our hearts. In the Gospel, Jesus passes the message to an imprisoned, and perhaps despairing, John the Baptist that He is truly here on earth and doing amazing things. God will soon come to us, live our lives with us and show us how much he loves us.
