Good News

At Mass last Sunday you will have discovered that the Parish has a new book. Not just any book but a very special one: a Book of the Gospels.

At Mass, the Book of the Gospels is shown special reverence: Deacon Brian (or a server if a deacon isn't present) carries it in the entrance procession; it is laid on the altar and then processed to the lectern when it is needed; the reading of the Gospel can be accompanied with candles and incense, and the deacon or priest will reverence the Book of the Gospels with a kiss after the reading (if the Bishop is the principle celebrant the book will be taken to him after the Gospel reading for him to kiss).

At one level this may all seem a bit of fuss and unnecessary pageantry. However, it has a real purpose: to emphasise the importance of sacred scripture and the primacy of the Gospels within it. The reading of the Gospel is the highlight of the Liturgy of the Word at Mass, when we all stand in unity to hear Christ speaking to us through his life and his teaching.

If these outward signs are designed to liturgically emphasise the importance of the Gospels: I then wonder if I give them the attention they deserve at Mass? Sometimes I am aware that I haven't actively listened to them at all. Perhaps because the stories are so familiar I become distracted by other thoughts or because, like this weekend's Gospel, the message seems a bit too challenging and I let it slip in one ear and out the other. I know that every now and then I need to be reminded and re-energised in my attention.

Jesus' teaching this week needs lots of attention and thought: can I give up everything to be a disciple? What does this mean for me now at this point in my life? For each of us the answer will be different but discovering this needs to start from listening to that Gospel read from our new book.
