Today is the feast of All Saints when we celebrate not only the saints that have been named, but all those that have entered the glory of heaven. Amongst the latter there may be many we have known personally.

While preaching on this feast day St Bernard asked:

Of what profit to the saints are our prayers and the honour we pay them?

Of what use is this feast day?

Of what use to them are honours paid on earth when our Father in heaven, fulfilling the truth of his Son's promise, has raised them to glory?

His answer:

"Our songs of praise do not profit them nor do they need our honours, nor anything our service can offer. **Surely, we are the ones to benefit**."

That is the point, it is we who benefit from this feast. As this *Year of Jubilee* draws to a close, this feast day brings into focus our final destination as *Pilgrims of Hope*. That one day we hope to enjoy their company in the presence of God.

It was only later in life that I began to realise more fully that the saints are not remote from us. We already enjoy their company while continuing our pilgrimage on this earth. Together with them we make up the Church, the Body of Christ. Whenever the Church celebrates the sacraments it is the whole Church that gathers to give praise and worship to God, not just those of us sitting in the pews. Do we appreciate that St Michael's welcomes the angels and saints when we gather for Mass?

On this feast day we are reassured that being more closely united to Christ, those who dwell in heaven have our wellbeing at heart. They want us to experience what they already enjoy, interceding for us to help us to follow their example.

I will leave the final word to two other saints:

"Do not weep, for I shall be more useful to you after my death and I shall help you then more effectively than during my life."
