The Laudato Si' Movement is now celebrating its tenth anniversary. The Repair Café at Springwater Church takes place the first Saturday of each month - can we make use of this service and reduce the waste that goes into landfill?

The support for CIRDIC has been longstanding and humbling, as is your more recent generosity towards the Reading Refugee Support Group. We also have a reliable group of volunteers who regularly help out at the foodbank - new volunteers are always welcome!

In recent weeks you have remembered the disadvantaged children in our area by donating Easter Eggs as well as those on the front line in Ukraine in the appeal for used candles.

Such small actions do mount up to make a difference to our lives, our planet and the disadvantaged. For Earth Day can you make a pledge to continue one of your Lenten acts or start a new one from Easter Sunday until Ash Wednesday 2026?
