PARISH NEWSLETTER

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

17/18 January 2026

At this time of year we look forward with resolutions to the year ahead but also look back to years gone by. And reading today's Gospel took me back to the 13th Century Carmelite priory at Aylesford where one summer over 35 years ago I was in a production of the Mystery plays, which have been put on since medieval times to dramatise events from the bible

One of the roles I was privileged to take on was John the Baptist. I did some basic research but got little further than that John lived a simple life, getting by on a diet of locusts and wild honey - and of course that he baptised Jesus and bore witness to his coming as the Messiah. As I wasn't following the Method approach there was no need to follow John's frugal diet, though I did wear a simple hessian robe and sandals, glad that we were performing outdoor in the summer!

Though simply acting in community theatre, there were many moments that felt spiritually profound. Their origin must have been in part from my Faith, in part from the beautiful, Holy setting where we regularly attended Mass – the priory sits in a 40 acre site with mixed mature woodland, a lake, and its grounds and chapels contain beautiful ceramic sculptures by the celebrated Polish artist Adam Kossowski. But a big part was the support of one the Brothers there at that time: the late Fr Wilfrid McGreal O. Carm. who often broadcast on BBC local and national radio. Fr McGreal, who baptised both our children, greatly enriched our spiritual life, in person and through his publications and broadcasts.

While scholars continue to debate the details and chronology of John the Baptist's life it's the words from John's Gospel that have become enshrined in our Mass when the priest holds up the consecrated Host before Holy Communion:

Behold the Lamb of God who takes a way the sins of the World!

Let us draw on whatever connects us to the wellsprings of our faith to make these words we hear each week, come fully alive in us. Amen
